Forty-third Annual Meeting - BERGEN 2017

The International Tunnelling and Underground Space Association held its forty-third meeting in Bergen, from 9 to 14 June 2017, in conjunction with the World Tunnel Congress 2017 "Surface challenges – underground solutions " organized by ITA and the Norwegian Tunnelling Society. More than 1600 persons participated in the Congress. 52 of the 74 Member Nations participated or were represented in the General Assembly.

MEMBERSHIP AND DECISIONS

Nigeria has been accepted as a new Member Nation.

The Member nation of Malaysia (Tunnelling and Underground Space Technical Division -The Institution of Engineers Malaysia) will host the next WTC 2020, in Kuala Lumpur, from 15 to 21 May, 2020.
